Dear LACCE Board of Directors:

I am writing as the engaged Council member from the City of Redondo Beach in the exploration of shifting to Community Choice Aggregation. As you may know, we are studying two options at the moment, the LACCE plan and South Bay Clean Power's proposal for a sub-regional approach.

I apologize that I cannot come and speak in person today, but would request and recommend that the Board delay passage of the Implementation Plan, the Request for proposals (RFP) for Power Supply and Schedule Coordinator, and the proposed MOU between Los Angeles County and LACCE. Each of these should provide a reasonable timeframe for our cities to finalize evaluation and allow for public review / further discussion before passage.

I request that no action be taken on these items today.

Community choice aggregation (CCA) is an important policy decision that can help local communities develop clean renewable energy. Meaningful participation of key stakeholders is valuable in ensuring that LACCE builds upon existing CCA's to become the national leader in sound policy. I only received two days notice of this meeting which is concerning as to the future of the way LACCE and it's board will be enacted / evaluated. Please do not start off on a perceived "wrong foot."

To ensure meaningful participation and a program that potentially a majority of cities would participate in, I request that LACCE schedule a public hearing that includes a presentation of the plan from LACCE staff, and an opportunity for the public and key stakeholders to ask questions and offer feedback before any final decision is approved.
